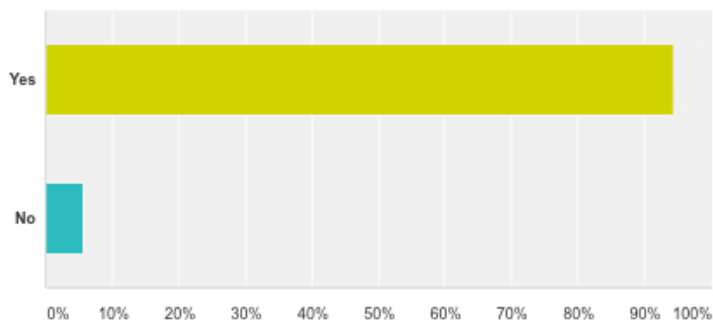


TRAUMA SURVEY RESULTS FOR PDS

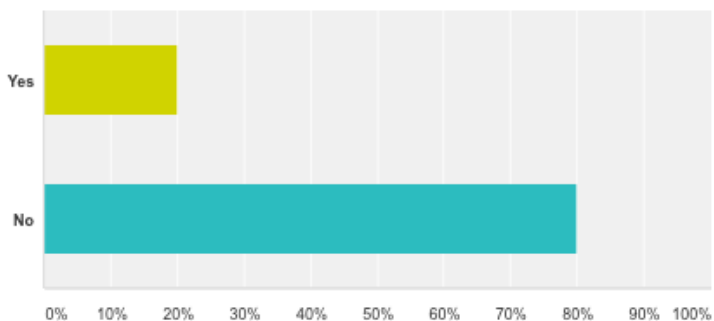

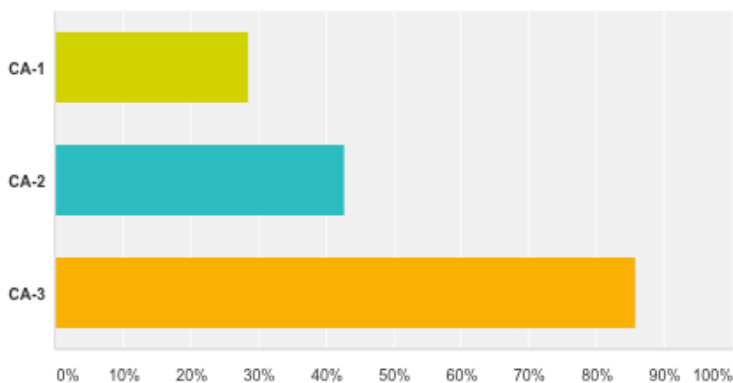

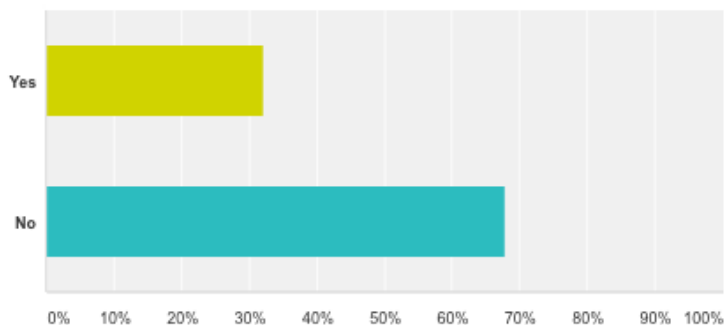

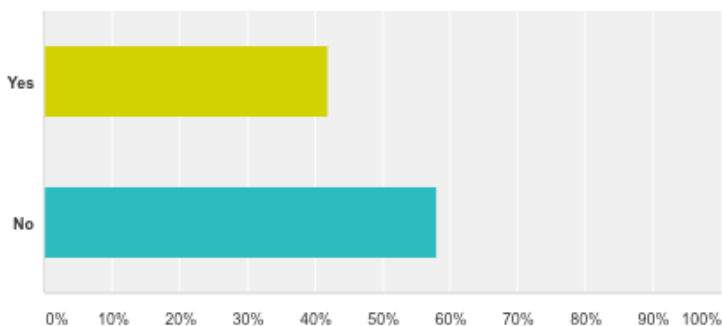

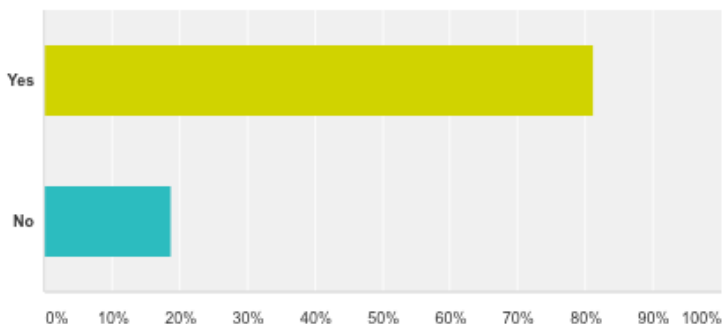

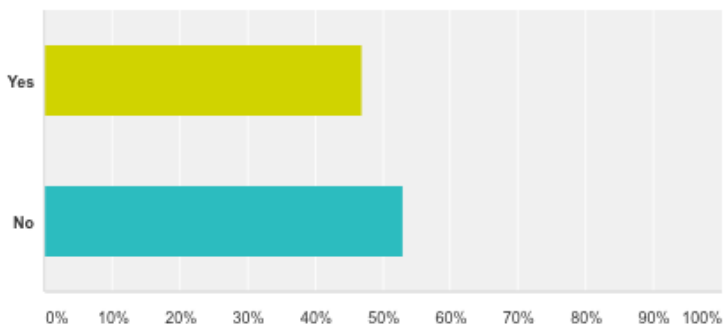
