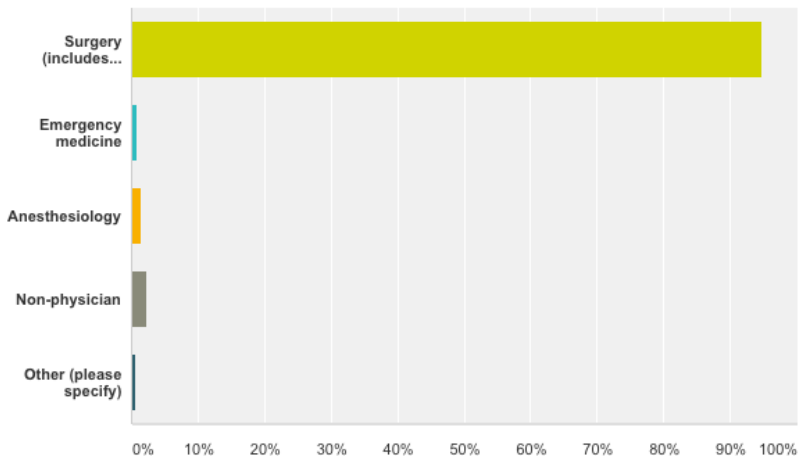

## What is your specialty?

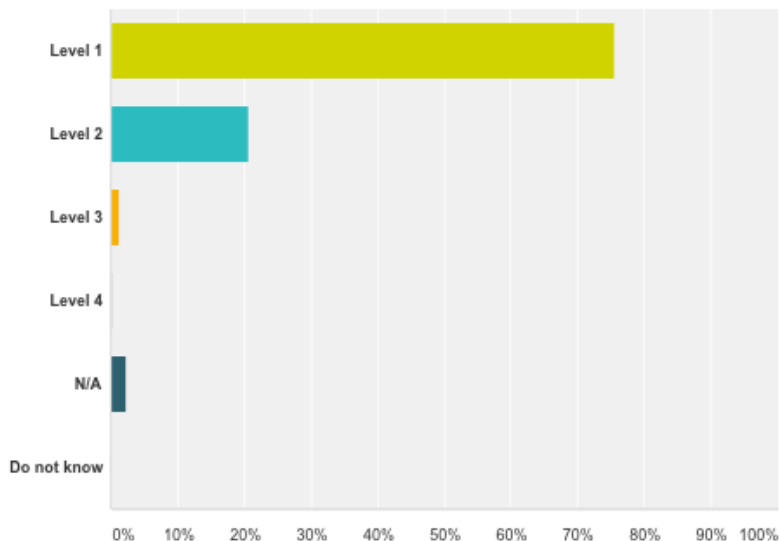

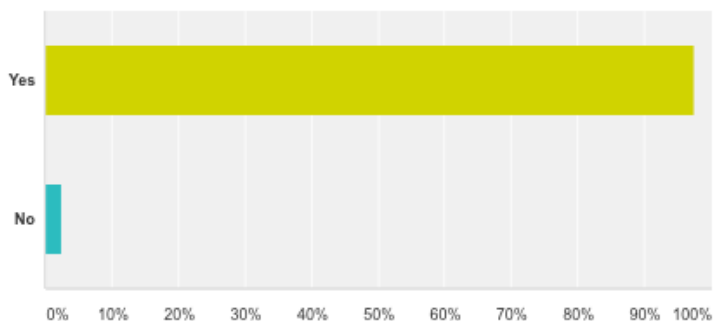

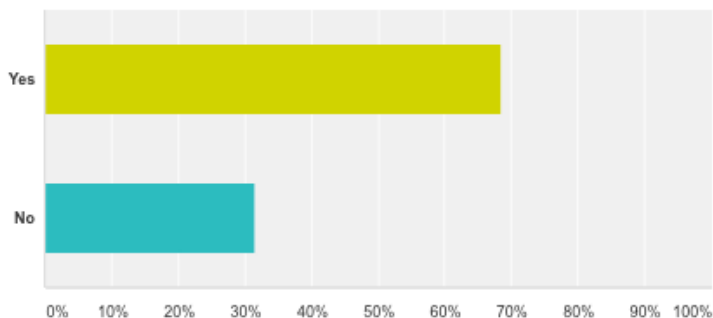

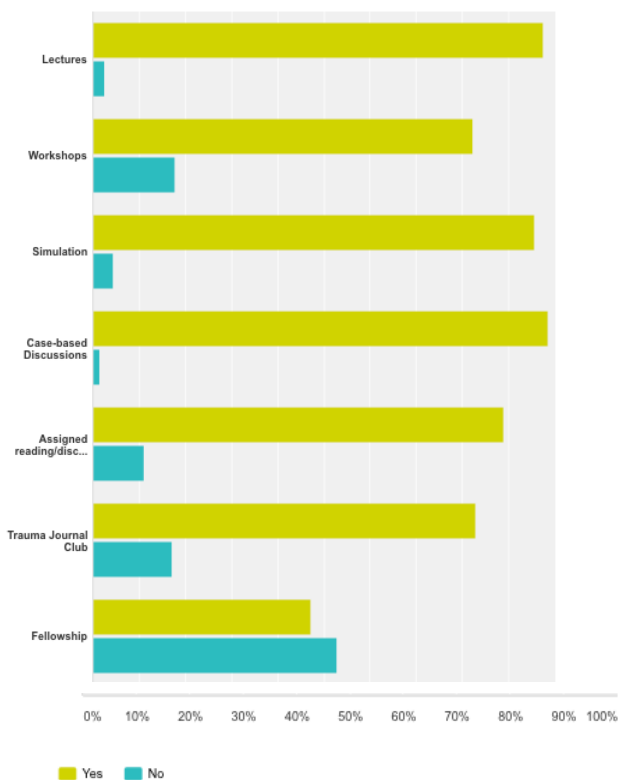
